From Father Fawcett

All of us can remember the advice of our mothers and grandmothers who gave us all kinds of advice on our health and safety. Even though I am 45 years old I still get lots of helpful advice from my mom. We know there is always something "going around", so as we enter the cold and flu season I would just like to give a few reminders about our liturgy and worship. We have again placed a bottle of hand sanitizer on the credence table by the altar for all Eucharistic Ministers to use before distributing Holy Communion. Also if you are ill, please consider refraining from holding hands during the Our Father, exchanging the Sign of Peace, and receiving from the cup at communion. Most of all if you are seriously ill stay home; it is not a sin to miss Mass due to serious illness. While I don't want to be overly reactionary to illnesses, I do think it is prudent to take some precautions.

While I am on the topic of health and safety, I want to let you know that we are going to begin locking the church at night. Our insurance company is mandating this for all parishes in the diocese and recently we have had a few things missing from our church. While it is sad that we must lock our church during the overnight hours it is really for everyone's safety and security that we do this. Senior Food Box Program: is a project of Feeding South Dakota. Individuals 60 and over are eligible to receive a box of food which contains 31 pounds of food plus cheese each month. The food comes from the USDA. Sign up at Pierre Area Referral Service, Southeast Community Center or Senior Citizen Centers in Pierre/Fort Pierre. Eligibility based on a households total gross income. 1 person allowable income is \$1,174; 2 person household is \$1,579; 3 person household is \$1,984. St. John's short term Church building maintenance needs.

St. John's Parish has had costly maintenance needs. Current maintenance needs are:

New furnaces and air conditioners for Padre Hall: They have outlived their life spans and are 30+ years old. Replacement included moving them out of the dirt and wet crawl space. *(Replacement completed - loan secured - repayment has started \$40,000).*

Parking Lot: In order to save our parking lot and ensure many more years of service we need to have it sawed and sealed. Cost will be approximately \$16,500. *(Parking Lot repair is almost completed - \$8,250 due upon completion).*

Roof: The church, rectory, and hall roof has been patched many times and matching shingles are no longer available. It is need of repairs. Cost to shingle the church, rectory and hall: \$36,000. *(Padre hall roof replacement completed - \$12,300). The church roof will be replaced next spring for \$13,000.)*

Padre Hall: needs ceiling and crawl space insulation. Cost: \$9,000. A concrete apron on alley side of hall needs to be installed. The crawl space is muddy and water from coming in from the alley needs to be addressed. *This will be a spring project.*

Our loan balance from the church basement renovation is \$58,000. We have taken out another Diocesan loan to cover the furnaces and air conditioners for \$40,000 for a total debt of \$98,000. To complete the roof and insulation needs we will need to secure another loan for \$45,000. Postponement in addressing these needs would only mean the costs will increase. We will not have a pledge drive at this time but are confident you will continue to help with the costs to maintain the integrity of your church buildings by using the building fund envelopes in your envelope packets.

ST. JOHN'S PROPOSAL TO HELP FEED OUR CHILDREN: Have you ever thought of how you feel when you are hungry - Perhaps inattentive, irritable and anxious? Imagine coming to school Monday morning in this condition and then trying to learn?

Last school year there were 314 children, pre-K through 5th grade in Pierre and Ft. Pierre, eligible for the free meals through the National School Lunch Programs? Thus fed during the school week, perhaps they had little or no food on weekends. Teachers in this country have noticed this with elementary students and created an idea for solving this problem. It's called the **Backpack Program**. Some of St. John's parishioners deliver all the backpack supplies for 250 children Friday mornings to Elementary schools in Pierre. Oahe, Inc. delivers to Stanley County school for 50 students. The children take their backpack home for the weekend and return them Monday for \$150 a year.

Cathy Mercer of Pierre Area Referral Service tells us that studies have shown that children who receive adequate nutrition do better in school and therefore have a better chance of breaking the cycle of poverty. The program operates solely through financial/food donations and fund raising efforts and only expense is food; all other support is provided by volunteers. Fr. Brian and St. John's Pastoral Council suggests we participate in a special collection at Masses one Sunday in the months of October, December, February and April. When we contribute, Cathy can buy in bulk and provide savings. Exact dates will be announced. There are also other ways to help by creating together fund raisers or conduct a food drive (needs are identified....contact Cathy), Volunteering to help fill sacks of food once or twice during the school year (all but three Thursdays evenings are now filled by volunteers) or Volunteer to help deliver or serve as alternates on Friday mornings from 9 am until 10 am or share your talent in technology, fund-raising, public relations or aspects of the program's ongoing work. Please consider this appeal and contribute as you can. May God bless this effort with abundance. *Our first collection brought nearly \$700!*
